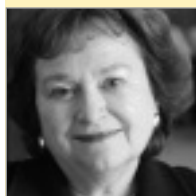

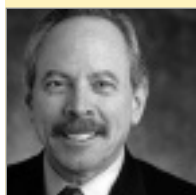

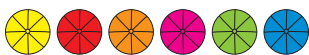

Diversity Across the Physician Education Continuum

The subject of diversity and the ways in which it is defined and included in medical education continues to present opportunities for rich discussion. Topics in the curriculum around diversity range from cultural competency to genetic medicine. Diversity involves sociological variables such as age, ethnicity, and gender.
