As an example of how to interpret this table, the 1.5 figure for South Alabama-Whiddon under Average Women Promotions to Associate Professor indicates that an average of 1.5 full-time women faculty per year were promoted to Associate Professor at the Frederick P. Whiddon College of Medicine at the University of South Alabama between academic year 2016–2017 and academic year 2019–2020, which represents 38% of the total average full-time faculty promotions to Associate Professor per year at the Frederick P. Whiddon College of Medicine at the University of South Alabama during the same time period (4.0).
