ANNOUNCEMENT.

The Collegiate year embraces a regular Autumn and Winter session; a special session for Practitioners only, and a Spring session.

THE REGULAR COURSE of lectures will commence on Tuesday, Sept. 28th, 1880, and close on Tuesday, March 29th, 1881, at which time the Commencement exercises will take place.

A SPECIAL COURSE FOR PRACTITIONERS will commence on Wednesday, the 30th of March, 1881, and continue until the 28th of April following. For particulars with reference to this course, see notice on page 10.

A SPRING COURSE, designed as a Reading and Recitation Term for students, in connection with daily Clinics in the hospital, will commence at the close of the Practitioners Course, and end on the 1st day of July following.

The Course of Instruction.—The curriculum of study is divided into three series or groups, and taught in three consecutive annual courses of lectures.

THE FIRST GROUP, OR JUNIOR COURSE, embraces Anatomy; Physiology; Histology; Microscopy; Materia Medica; General Chemistry.

THE SECOND GROUP, OR MIDDLE COURSE, embraces Anatomy (concluded); General Pathology and Pathological Anatomy; General Therapeutics; Nervous and Mental Diseases; Medical Jurisprudence and Hygiene; and Medical Chemistry.

THE THIRD GROUP, OR SENIOR COURSE, includes the Theory and Practice of Medicine, and Clinical Medicine; the Principles and Practice of Surgery, and Clinical Surgery; the Medical and Surgical Diseases of Women, and Clinical Gynecology; Obstetrics and the Diseases of Children; Ophthalmology and Otology; with daily attendance upon a systematic course of clinical

instruction in all the special departments, at the bedside of patients in the Hospitals, and in the College and Dispensary clinics.

The Professorships.—The classified course of instruction permits such subdivisions that the College has constituted thirteen distinct Professorships, thus securing a thoroughness of teaching not otherwise attainable; and yet the arrangement of lectures is such that those who desire to attend in any particular department can have the opportunity.

Requirements for Admission.—All applicants for admission must possess at least a good English education, and present satisfactory evidence of the same. If an applicant is a graduate of a literary college, or presents certificates from some scientific school or Academy, it will be accepted in lieu of an examination, otherwise he must sustain a satisfactory examination before a committee of the Faculty.

Advanced Standing.—While a large majority of our students pass through the regular graded course of instruction, corresponding with the required three years of medical study, it has been deemed advisable to make suitable provision for those who have partially completed their studies elsewhere. Students, therefore, who have completed one full year of medical study, and have accredited certificates to that effect, may be admitted to the *Second*, or *Middle Course*, by sustaining satisfactory examinations in Physiology, Materia Medica, and General Chemistry. The final examinations in Anatomy do not occur until the close of the second.

Students who have studied medicine two years, and have attended one full course of instruction in some recognized medical college, can be admitted to the *Third*, or *Senior Course*, by sustaining satisfactory examinations upon the subjects enumerated in the first and second courses.

Examinations.—Those requiring preliminary examinations as to literary qualifications will meet the Examining Board of the Faculty during the *first* week of the regular term.

Those who apply for advanced standing will be examined by the Professors whose Chairs they desire to pass during the *third*

week in October. Students who may fail in either of these examinations will be entitled to a second examination during the *third* week in December.

Daily examinations will be conducted by the several Professors, in connection with their lectures, during the entire term.

The final examinations will be held during the last week of the college term; of the Junior Class for admission to the Middle Course; of the Middle Class to enter the Senior Course; and of the Senior Class upon the subjects embraced in the Senior Course preparatory to graduation.

Clinical Advantages.—One of the marked features in the course is the intimate relation between clinical and didactic teaching, and the prominence that is given to *clinical* instruction.

In the Gynecological Department a large number of female patients present themselves for treatment, and the Senior students are personally instructed by the Professor and his assistants in every detail connected with the treatment of diseases of women. In this department the facilities for studying Diseases of Women are unsurpassed. Each Senior student is trained by the Professor or assistants in the minute details of physical examinations, and the manner of treating the various diseases of women. In the Surgical branch of this Department all the minor and most of the major operations are performed in the presence of the students.

MERCY HOSPITAL, adjoining the College building, is a new and elegant structure affording ample means for the study of all varieties of acute diseases at the bedside of the patients. Clinical instruction is here imparted daily; each special department being under the control of the Professor who lectures upon that subject in the College. Every member of the Senior class will have an opportunity of serving for an allotted time as *dresser* in the Hospital, for which he will receive a certificate at the end of the session. *Obstetrical cases are awarded to each of the Senior students who attend the same*, at the Hospital, under the immediate supervision of the Professor of Obstetrics. During the past three years every Senior student has had one or more obstetrical cases each session assigned to his care. The Hospital, which is attended.

only by members of the Faculty of Chicago Medical College, with the Dispensary and College Clinics, furnish not only an abundance, but even a superabundance of Clinical material; yet if students desire further Clinical instruction they can obtain it in COOK COUNTY HOSPITAL, with which Professors Isham, Hollister and Merriman are connected, and which admits all medical students in the city on equal terms. The Cook County Hospital allows the same privilege to the Chicago Medical College and its students that it does to any other institution.

THE DISPENSARY, located in the College building, where thousands of patients apply for treatment, affords ample opportunity for the study of all those forms of disease usually met with in office practice. Patients present themselves in large numbers each day, and are assigned to particular departments, according to the nature of their diseases. There are *eight* of these departments, with separate rooms where the special forms of disease are treated. The clinical class is divided into small sections, and for an allotted time each section is assigned in regular order to each of the several departments. Under competent instructors they thus become familiar with the best methods of examination and treatment not only of diseases in general but in all the specialties as well.

THE DAILY COLLEGE CLINICS afford rare opportunities of clinical instruction. Diseases of special interest are here presented and described; all varieties of surgical operations are performed in the presence of the class, and clinical teaching in all the special departments is amply illustrated as patients are presented for examination and treatment.

In the Hospital, College and Dispensary Departments over *fourteen thousand* patients were treated during the last year.

The Anatomical Department of the College offers the best of opportunities for the study of anatomy.

The dissecting rooms are of the most approved construction, and the special facilities for the preservation of material are such that the supply is absolutely unfailing.

The Chemical Laboratory is very perfect in its appointments, and every student is trained, by his own work, till he is

familiar with the essentials of both General and Medical Chemistry.

Microscopy.—The College is amply furnished with microscopes, and students are trained in their use, and pursue systematic studies of both healthy and diseased structures, and are made familiar with all those methods of examination in which the microscope becomes essential.

The Museum.—This department represents, in addition to its complete anatomical illustrations, one of the finest collections of osteological specimens to be found in this country. Full suites of specimens have been added which represent the whole domain of *Materia Medica*. Pathological specimens are here presented in abundance, and casts representing morbid anatomy, and forms to illustrate the various methods of surgical dressing, are in ample supply. In short, the aim of the Faculty has been to place at the command of the students the very latest and best facilities for acquiring a thorough medical education, and neither pains nor expense has been spared to assure that result.

Conditions of Graduation.—The candidates must present evidence of the following qualifications: 1. Good moral character. 2. Three years study. 3. Age, twenty-one years or over. 4. Dissection, Hospital attendance, and two or more courses of Lectures, of which the last must be at this College. 5. Must pass the regular examination. 6. Must deposit with the Recording Secretary by February 1st, a satisfactory Thesis. Students from other colleges must also deposit certificates as to qualification No. 4.

Physiological Laboratory.—This department will be opened during the coming year. The generous aid of the Alumni of the College has placed it upon a permanent basis, and the means will be ample for experimental studies in physiology and pathology, by the aid of vivisection and kindred means of investigation.

Prizes.—The Dean of the Faculty offers, annually, a Prize for the best inaugural Thesis presented by the Graduating Class, to be awarded by a Committee of the Faculty.

The Rea Anatomical Prizes are, viz: First Prize to the best Anatomist, open to all classes. Second Prize to the best Anatomist, open to the Junior class.

DR. N. SENN, of Milwaukee, in behalf of the Alumni Association, offers annually a Standard Medical or Surgical Work to be awarded for the best *Anatomical Preparation*.

DR. C. W. EARLE, of Chicago, in behalf of the same Association, offers a Standard Work on Diseases of Children for the best Essay on that subject.

Both the SENN and EARLE Prizes are open for competition by all graduates and students of the Chicago Medical College.

The Preparations and Essays intended for competition must be in the hands of the Secretary of the Association, Dr. D. A. K. STEELE, of Chicago, on or before February 1st of each year. The preparations are to be regarded as the property of the College Museum. These prizes will be awarded by the Committee on Prize Essays appointed by the Alumni Association.

The Professor of Medical and Surgical Diseases of Women offers two prizes to be awarded by a Committee of the Faculty. One for the best report of the Gynecological Clinic, and one for best thesis on an assigned subject.

PRACTITIONERS' COURSE.

This course is designed for the special benefit of practitioners, and is entirely distinct from the regular course for students. It will commence the day following the public Commencement, and will continue four weeks.

A prominent feature of this course will be its carefully selected series of patients, to illustrate by clinical teaching at the bedside in the Hospital and in the Dispensary the most approved methods of treatment, not only in Medicine and Surgery in general, but in Gynecology, Nervous Diseases, Ophthalmology and Otology, and other Special Diseases. From two to three hours each day will be devoted to Clinical instruction.

A practical course upon Surgical Anatomy, illustrated by dissections, will afford a valuable opportunity for reviewing this most important subject.

The dissecting room will be at the disposal of those who wish to review anatomy, and the supply of material will be abundant.

Practical work in the Laboratory can be pursued by all who desire.

A special course will be given in Pathological Anatomy, illustrated by diagrams and with microscopes, giving the latest views and discoveries in Pathological Histology.

Special courses of Didactic Lectures will also be given, having reference to the needs of those who desire to make a brief, yet

thorough, practical review of their professional studies. A programme of the course will be issued in January, and will be mailed to any address upon application to the Secretary of the Faculty. The fee for the entire course is thirty dollars; for any particular department of the course, ten dollars; to be paid in advance to the Registrar of the College.

INAUGURAL SESSION OF THE PRACTITIONERS' COURSE.

The names of the medical gentlemen in attendance upon the first session of the Practitioners' Course will be found on pp. 17, 18.

Their estimate of the plan and course of instruction is so briefly and explicitly stated in a series of resolutions unanimously adopted at the close of the session, that we venture to reproduce them for the consideration of the profession at large.

Resolved, That in establishing the *Practitioners' Course*, this College is seeking to meet a want long felt by the profession in the west, and the eminent success with which the Faculty have been able to present in rapid review the essentials in Medicine and Surgery, together with the latest advances in all the special departments so fully meets our approval that we bespeak for this course the hearty coöperation of all who desire to avail themselves of such advantages.

Resolved, That the thanks of the class are due, and are hereby tendered to the Faculty of the Chicago Medical College for their untiring effort to make the "Practitioners' Course" a success.

Resolved, That the members of this class will ever cherish with pleasing memories this grand social union, and these days of professional feasting, and we take pleasure in commending this practical course to all those who desire further instruction in our noble profession.

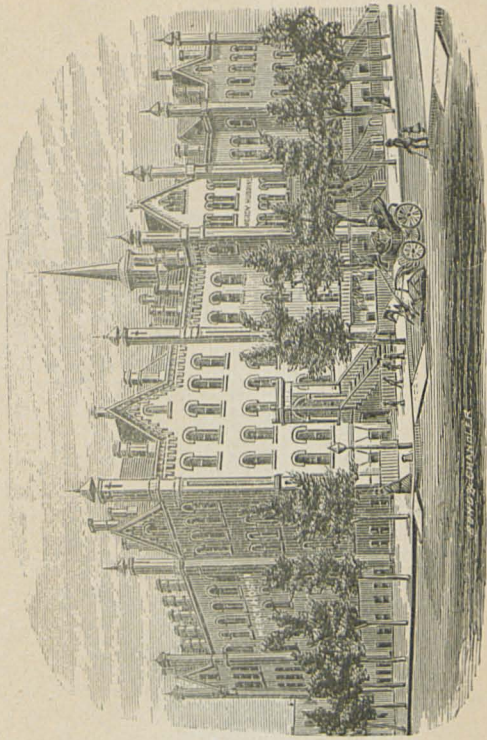
