Dear Fellow Northeast OSR Reps,

As the newly-elected northeast regional chairperson for the OSR, I would like to let you know first how excited I am about the job, and second how things are progressing with the April regional meeting.

I was thrilled by the interest and enthusiasm expressed by everyone at the national OSR meeting in New Orleans. The newsletter will be a joint effort by Jeralyn Bernier (Brown U.) and Mark Seigel (Columbia U.). Contributions may be in the form of articles, letters, editorials, info sharing, and requests for information. We also need to work again on identifying people at our schools for fourth-year interview visits for next year. For those who already have submitted lists, please reaffirm those students' participation and let Yvonne Brouard (Pittsburgh) know of any changes. Sara Johansen (Dartmouth U.) and I were also thinking of the possibly planning a retreat or social gathering somewhere in the northeast in the interval between the national and the regional meetings. The aim would be to promote cohesiveness and sociability in our region.

The regional meeting will be held April 8-10 in Boston. Traditionally, our meetings have been held jointly and in parallel with the regional GSA meeting. I had a very productive meeting at the National Meeting with Ethel Weinberg, who heads the Northeast Group on Student Affairs. We talked over last year's problems and then sketched a rough plan for this year's meeting. I will be attending the Northeast GSA steering committee meeting on December 5. This will allow us direct input in the planning of the conference. We have already been promised price cuts for registration of student OSR members who attend. I, in turn, assured Dr. Weinberg that we will pre-register as early as possible, so that she will have a better idea of the numbers involved. That means that you will have to plan early, setting aside those dates or arranging for an alternate. In order to make this as insightful and productive a meeting as possible, we will need the full participation of all the schools.

I would appreciate your input below on themes for the meeting as well as topics you would like covered. If you are interested in helping to coordinate the conference for speaker selection, discussion topics, or social events, please indicate that as well.

I believe that we can make this into an excellent meeting, from which we can take both ideas and inspiration, as well as potential mechanisms for implementing those ideas at our schools.
