Dr. Cardarelli is Professor and Chair for the Department of Family & Community Medicine for the University of Kentucky College of Medicine. He received his doctor of osteopathy and master of public health degrees from University of North Texas Health Science Center at Ft. Worth and his master in health administration from the University of Cincinnati. Dr. Cardarelli completed a residency in Family Medicine and a fellowship in Faculty Development at Baylor College of Medicine, Houston.

He currently directs the Kentucky Ambulatory Practice-based Research Network that helps primary care clinics implement quality improvement models to improve the care they deliver to their populations.
