In 2013, the methodology for acquiring race and ethnicity information was updated. 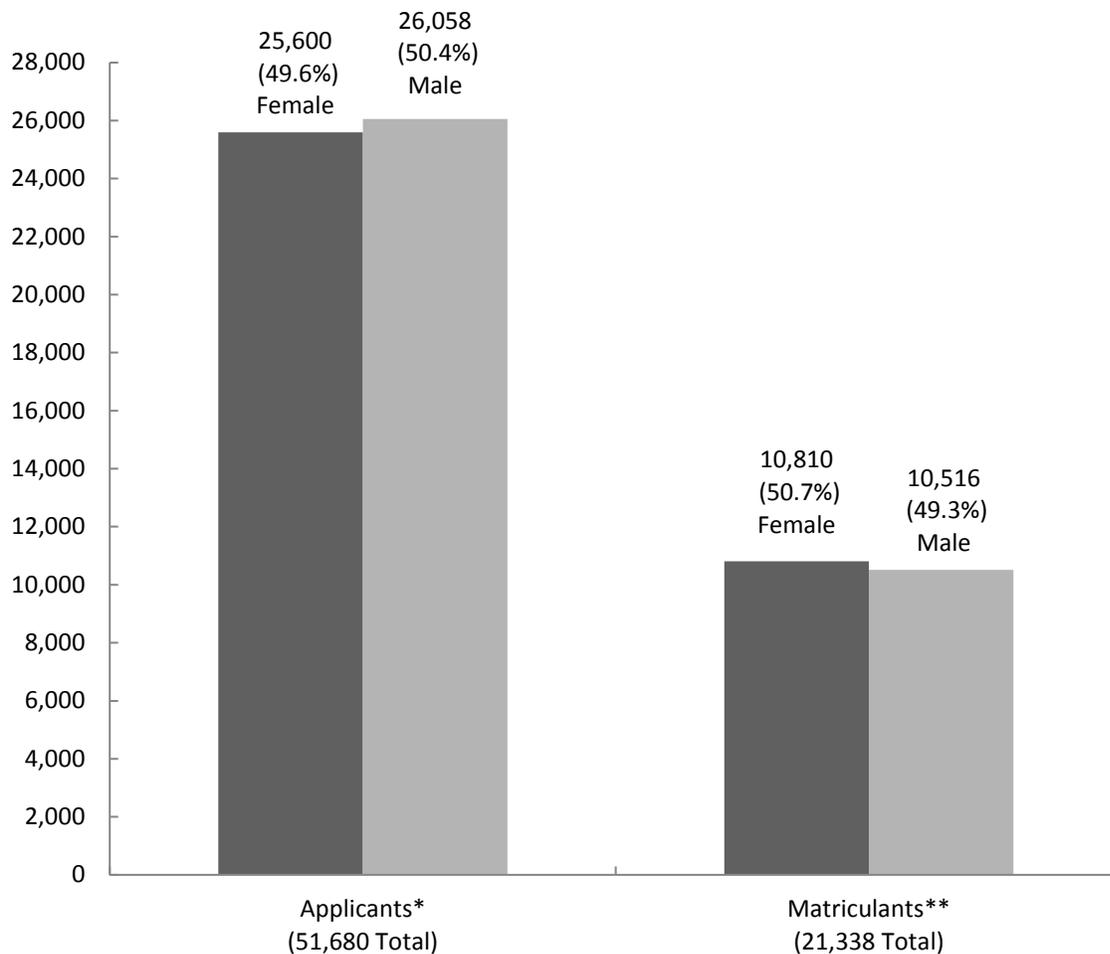
