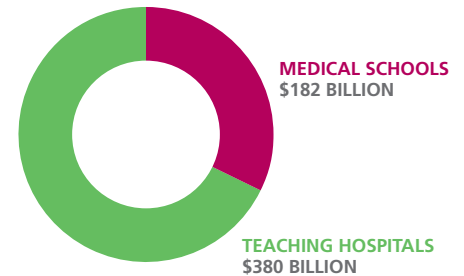

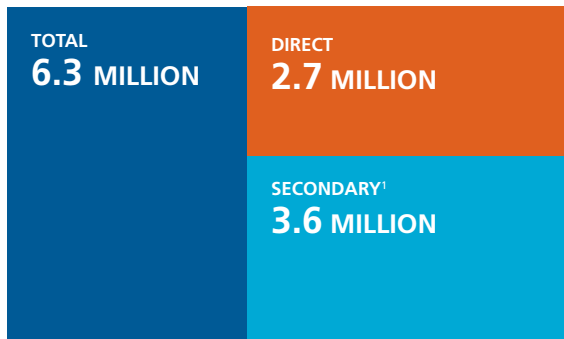
INCREASE THE SIZE OF THE ECONOMY BY
