Matthew Hudson, PhD, MPH

Dr. Hudson is the Cancer Care Delivery Research (CCDR) Director, and Comparative Effectiveness Research (CER) Director for the Greenville Health System (Greenville, S.C.). He is also a Clinical Assistant Professor of Biomedical Sciences at the University of South Carolina School of Medicine Greenville, and adjunct faculty member at the Arnold School of Public Health (University of South Carolina).

Dr. Hudson earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology from the University of San Francisco, his Master of Public Health degree (Behavioral Science Emphasis) from the University of California, at Berkeley, and his Doctoral degree in Evaluative Clinical Science from Dartmouth College.

As CCDR Director, Dr. Hudson oversees scholarship examining how social factors, financing systems, organizational structures and processes, health technologies, provider and patient behavior impact cancer care access, cost, and quality. Dr. Hudson aspires to enhance access to cancer research for disenfranchised populations by integrating CCDR into communities. He concurs with the National Cancer Institute's (NCI) stances that community-informed CCDR will provide a broadly applicable evidence base contributing to improved patient outcomes, and reduction in cancer disparities. Dr. Hudson is also a member of NCI's Coordinating Committee for CCDR. This committee facilitates research collaborations between community oncology research sites, standardizes auditing procedures and data collection between sites, and operational procedures supporting CCDR activities.

As CER Director, Dr. Hudson facilitates the generation and synthesis of evidence comparing the benefit and harms of alternative strategies to prevent, diagnose, treat, or monitor clinical conditions or improve care delivery. Dr. Hudson's CER platform informs the development of transdisciplinary care teams via education and peer review of clinical scholarship. He is a lecturer, course director, and advisor to medical students, certified registered nursing anesthetists, and health service doctoral students. He also serves on the editorial board of the Greenville Health System's
