

Summer internship with the AAMC Curriculum Inventory (CI)

The AAMC CI is recruiting for a paid summer 2020 intern! The intern is based in the medical education department in the Washington, D.C. office. The time commitment is approximately **early June through early August** (10 weeks), and the internship is paid at a competitive rate.

The intern's major project will be creating national curriculum reports. Examples include:

- [Liaison Committee on Medical Education](#) (LCME) topics,
- Topic priorities for the AAMC (e.g., telemedicine curriculum),
- Frequently requested government and media reports,
- Frequently requested custom reports by members

The national curriculum reports will include opportunities to work with staff in library sciences to conduct and synthesize literature searches, and to include CI data graphics. *This will give the intern a unique awareness on medical education curricula on a national level.*

The AAMC has a number of [summer internships](#) available for students currently enrolled part-time or full-time in an undergraduate or graduate degree program at an accredited college or university. There are full-time (35-hour week) and a limited number of part-time opportunities available, most of which takes place during the summer months.

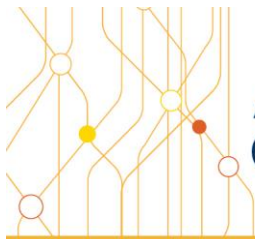
