As an example of how to interpret this table, the 1.8 figure for South Alabama under Average Women Promotions to Associate Professor indicates that an average of 1.8 full-time women faculty per year were promoted to Associate Professor at the University of South Alabama College of Medicine between academic year 2015–2016 and academic year 2018–2019, which represents 35% of the total average full-time faculty promotions to Associate Professor per year at the University of South Alabama College of Medicine during the same time period (5.1).
