Dr. Marc Basson received his MD degree from the University of Michigan, his PhD from Yale University, and his MBA from Wayne State. He began his academic career as a member of the faculty of the Department of Surgery at Yale and was recruited to Wayne State where he served as Associate Chief of Staff for Surgical Services at the John D. Dingell VA Medical Center before moving to Michigan State as Chair of the Department of Surgery in the College of Human Medicine. He then moved to the University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences, where he is Senior Associate Dean for Medicine and Research, managing the medical education program (including admissions, student affairs and curriculum), a network of residency and fellowship programs across the state, continuing medical education, and the school's research portfolio.

Dr. Basson recently led the school through an overhaul of the medical curriculum. He also serves as Director and Principal Investigator for the DaCCoTA network, a consortium of universities and health care systems across North and South Dakota dedicated to clinical and translational research. Dr. Basson has been President of the Association of VA Surgeons, an examiner for the American Board of Surgery, and a member of survey teams for the LCME. He has published over 300 papers in basic and clinical research as well as medical education and ethics.
