

Diane C. Bodurka, MD, MPH, FACS The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center

Dr. Diane C. Bodurka is the Professor of Gynecologic Oncology and Reproductive Medicine, Vice President/Chief Education & Training Officer, and Designated Institutional Official at The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center. She serves as Assistant Dean of The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center UTHealth Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences and Accreditation Liaison, Southern Association of Colleges and Schools — Commission on Colleges, for The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center School of Health Professions. Dr. Bodurka earned a BS in Psychobiology from the University of California, Los Angeles, and her medical degree from Georgetown University School of Medicine. She trained as a resident in Obstetrics and Gynecology at The University of Alabama at Birmingham and then as a fellow in Gynecologic Oncology at The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer.

A member of the MD Anderson faculty since 1996, Dr. Bodurka performs surgery on women with gynecologic cancers and prescribes chemotherapy and immunotherapy. Her extensive and outstanding clinical experience has been recognized by patients and colleagues, as demonstrated by her consistent inclusion as one of America's Top Doctors, Best Doctors in America, and America's Top Oncologists.

Dr. Bodurka directed the MD Anderson Cancer Center Gynecologic Oncology Fellowship Program from 1996 until 2012 as Associate Director, and shortly thereafter as Director, training over 180 fellows for gynecologic oncology careers. The program produces clinician scholars and physician-scientists well-prepared to advance the field of gynecologic oncology. She also served as Director of the department's NIH/NCI T32 Training Grant for the training of academic gynecologic oncologists. Subsequently, as PI, Dr. Bodurka secured the grant's first competitive renewal. She has served in an advisory capacity for many training grants, as well as Career Enhancement Program Director for the Uterine SPORE since 2003.

In 2013, Dr. Bodurka assumed the roles of Vice President for Clinical Education and Designated Institutional Official and in 2017 was appointed Vice President for Education. In 2018, she was named Chief Education & Training Officer, responsible for more than 4,000 clinical and research trainees yearly, as well as for the institution's education enterprise. In 2020, Dr. Bodurka was appointed as Associate Director for Education of MD Anderson's Cancer Center Support Grant and coordinates research training programs across all career stages through the grant's Cancer Research Career Enhancement Core. She works with others to develop inclusive education pathway programs for diverse groups of learners. Dr. Bodurka provides exemplary leadership that supports MD Anderson's mission area of education by developing outcomesbased instructional programs that serve undergraduate and graduate students, trainees, professionals, employees, and the public. Her emphasis on collaboration and teaming has enabled institutional stakeholders to work together to advance the science and delivery of education.
