Congressional Action on Student Loans

Debt Ceiling Legislation - Fiscal Responsibility Act

Signed into law by President Biden on June 3rd.

- Limits overall discretionary spending for the next two fiscal years.
- Rescinds nearly \$30 billion in unspent COVID-19 relief aid, including unobligated funds to the Office of Federal Student Aid (FSA) for student aid administration.
- Codifies August 30 as the end of the student loan repayment pause.
 - Secretary of Education no longer has authority to implement an extension.
 - · Awaiting operational guidance from Department of Education.

Joint Resolution 45

- In a separate action, Congress approved Joint Resolution 45.
- Legislation to authorize the Congressional Review Act to overturn the Department of Education's federal student loan forgiveness plan, end pause on payments & interest.
 - Presidential veto extremely likely.



Pending Supreme Court Rulings

- Awaiting rulings from the Supreme Court in June on key cases affecting higher education:
 - Students for Fair Admission v. Harvard and Students for Fair Admission v. University of North Carolina
 - Challenge to the limited consideration of race and ethnicity in higher education admissions with potential impacts for financial aid.
 - Biden v. Nebraska & Department of Education v. Brown
 - Challenge to legality of Biden Administration's student debt forgiveness plan.
- Rulings expected on both cases this June.



Department of Education Updates

- Regulations to streamline and improve federal student loan debt relief measures to take effect July 1, 2023.
 - Medical student borrowers to benefit from changes to interest capitalization polices, improvements to the Public Service Loan Forgiveness Program and one-time payment account adjustments.
- Awaiting final regulations on Department of Education's <u>proposed</u> new Income-Driven Repayment plan with more favorable terms for medical school borrowers.
 - Streamlines federal loan repayment offerings; eliminates accrual of unpaid monthly interest.
 - Expect final rules to be published before November 1, 2023, with a July 1, 2024 implementation.



Department of Education Updates

- Department of Education's Office of Federal Student Aid issues letter to higher education deans/presidents <u>underscoring</u> need for financial aid office resources, training and support to stay compliant, navigate forthcoming policy changes to federal student aid processes and administration.
- Upcoming changes include:
 - New Pell Grant and Federal Aid Eligibility Determination
 - Expanding Access to Federal Aid
 - Streamlining the FAFSA Form
 - Fostering direct data exchange with IRS to provide income information on the FAFSA form.
- All changes to be fully implemented beginning with the 2024–25 academic year.



AAMC Comment Letters – Department of Education

- AAMC/AACOM issue joint <u>comment letter</u> opposing expanded Third Party Servicer (TPS) definitions.
 - Expanded guidance rescinded and <u>delayed indefinitely</u> due to higher education community pushback.
 - Department has since clarified that contracts involving clinical or externship opportunities not considered TPS entities.
 - Rescinded language prohibits contracts between colleges and foreign-owned or operated third-party servicers.
 - Awaiting further guidance on inclusion of financial aid counseling services included as TPS entity.
 - Further discussion likely in upcoming negotiated rulemaking.
- AAMC joins American Council on Education <u>community letter</u> on foreign gift and contract disclosures under Section 117 that supports process improvements, engagement with stakeholders and discussion on donor confidentiality.



2022-23 LCME Part I-B Questionnaire Coming Soon

- 2022-2023 LCME Part I-B Student Financial Aid Questionnaire to open on Friday, July 14, 2023 with a due date of on Friday, September 15, 2023.
- Format change LCME Part I-B was recently reengineered from Verint to Excel.
 - Aligns with other AAMC surveys migrated to Excel.
 - New format will include survey contents, including a Table of Contents, Instructions, and FAQs in an Excel-based survey.
 - Optimized to follow guidelines from the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) for digital accessibility.
 - Format change only; questions and section cadence largely unchanged from prior years.






- The 2024 meeting will be held in lieu of the stand-alone financial aid meeting that year as dictated per the GSA meeting calendar.






