

## 2024 GIR Vince Sheehan Service Award Winner TED HANSS

Ted Hanss currently serves as a lecturer in Health Management & Policy at the University of Michigan School of Public Health. He has been involved in the AAMC GIR since 2004 and was elected the GIR Steering Committee from 2011 to 2017, including serving as Chair. He is a graduate of the GIR Leadership Institute, a GIR Fellow, and a faculty member for the Leading Information Technology professional development institute. Ted has also been Chair of the MedBiquitous Steering Committee. He has presented numerous times at GIR conferences and workshops.



In addition to Ted's work with the GIR, he helped create additional learning opportunities by partnering with Vince

Sheehan and Boyd Knosp to run the AMC-IT forum, a regional unconference for IT folks in academic medicine. Ted is known for his on-going leadership, dedication, and engagement in the IT in academic medicine community, and is being honored with this award for the difference he has made to so many in the GIR community and the positive and long-lasting impact he has had on the GIR. He has played many roles within academic medicine, but two stand out: CIO at the University of Michigan Medical School and Health Sciences CIO at Yale. Ted also continues to teach about informatics at the University of Michigan School of Public Health. Outside of his two organizations, Ted has played key roles in a number of other organizations, including Internet 2, Educause, and MedBiquitous. Besides lecturing, Ted now serves as a consultant and continues to advise schools and other organizations about IT in academic medicine.
