GBA/GIP Webinar on Leveraging AI to Enhance Effectiveness in Administration, Analytics, and Leadership

Join us on Thursday, September 25th from 2:00 PM-3:00 PM ET. for the first session in the *Artificial Intelligence (AI) in Academic Medicine* webinar series highlighting key AI use cases aimed at streamlining administrative and operational tasks. First, the speakers will describe the development of DOMINIQ (Department of Medicine's Interactive Navigator for Inquiries & Queries), a secure chatbot that simplifies access to policies in finance, HR, academic affairs, IT, and more. Next, presenters will examine how workflows in research administration, clinical revenue, and faculty productivity can be improved by applying AI to Python scripting, complex Excel formulas, and MS Power Automate. Lastly, the speakers will delve into an innovative use case where leaders engage in reflective dialogue with GPT models to enhance their interpersonal communication skills. Data of Interest to GBA Members: Faculty Roster Benchmark Reports

For benchmarking purposes, Faculty Roster representatives have access to aggregate school-specific information in the <u>Faculty Roster application</u>. Log in using your AAMC

username and password and navigate to Reports > Benchmarking Reports. The benchmarking reports allow you to see counts of full-time faculty and department chairs at each U.S. medical school as of a user-specified snapshot date. The results can be broken out by various combinations of department type, rank, race/ethnicity, gender, degree, and age. You can also define a comparison group of medical schools, such as by public/private status, geographical region, or a list of peer institutions. You can trend faculty counts going back to 1966 and chair counts going back to 1977.

AAMC applauds introduction of bill to reduce physician shortage

The AAMC has endorsed the introduction this week of the Resident Physician Shortage Reduction Act of 2025. This bipartisan legislation would gradually add 14,000 Medicare-supported medical residency positions over seven years as well as codify the Rural Residency Planning and Development Program. "As our nation's population ages and the demand for medical care continues to rise, Congress must take immediate action to tackle the critical physician shortage that threatens the health and well-being of our nation," said AAMC President and CEO David J. Skorton, MD.

The AAMC has been closely monitoring and analyzing the impact of National Institutes of Health (NIH) grant terminations on U.S. institutions. A new AAMC analysis focuses on a key area of impact: terminations of research training and career development grants that help build the next generation of the biomedical research workforce. Of 2,282 NIH grants terminated as of June 4, 38% were research training and career development grants, accounting for \$512 million in lost funding across U.S. institutions.
