As an example of how to interpret this table, the 1.8 figure for South Alabama under Average Women Promotions to Associate Professor indicates that an average of 1.8 full-time women faculty per year were promoted to Associate Professor at the University of South Alabama College of Medicine between academic year 2014–2015 and academic year 2017–2018, which represents 32% of the total average full-time faculty promotions to Associate Professor per year at the University of South Alabama College of Medicine during the same time period (5.6).
