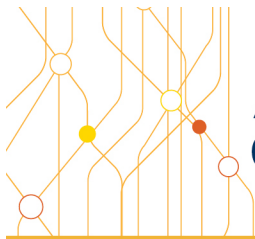
We will also continue with our regularly scheduled monthly series on the second Wednesday of the month at 1:00pm EST.
