Wendy Lane, MD, MPH is a pediatrician and researcher at the University of Maryland School of Medicine. She is board certified in General Pediatrics, Child Abuse Pediatrics, and Preventive Medicine. Dr. Lane received her medical degree from the University of Pennsylvania, and then completed her Pediatric residency and Masters in Public Health at the University of North Carolina. She completed a Preventive Medicine residency at the University of Maryland, and then a fellowship in Child Abuse and Neglect at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. She is currently an Associate Professor in the Department of Epidemiology and Public Health and the Department of Pediatrics at the University of Maryland and serves as Medical Director at the Baltimore Child Abuse Center. Dr. Lane was recently appointed as the Co-Director of the Program in Health Disparities and Population Health at the University of Maryland School of Medicine.

Dr. Lane's research focuses on child maltreatment and maternal and child health. Dr. Lane serves as the Principal Investigator for B'more for Healthy Babies Upton/Druid Heights, a community-based and community-engaged intervention to improve birth outcomes.



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She also examines outcomes of maltreatment for children, and development and evaluation of maltreatment prevention programs. She examines professional issues such as disparities in the medical evaluation, identification and reporting of maltreatment. In addition, Dr. Lane also performs medical evaluations for suspected maltreatment at BCAC, the University of Maryland Medical Center, and the Howard County Child Advocacy Center.
